Culture of Life Corner

How Does the “Culture of Life” Work at St Michael High School?

One of the things that makes Saint Michael the Archangel High School unique is the emphasis that it gives to preparing our students to promote a Culture of Life. In association with American Life League, SMHS is engaged in a long term project to consolidate our experiences as a Culture of Life school into curriculum materials, guidebooks and presentations which can be published and shared in various ways with other schools, thereby influencing even more lives in the future by promoting the Catholic Church’s teachings regarding the sanctity of life.

SMHS has provided course material, lectures, activities and internships that espouse a Culture of Life to aid our young people in making a difference for the better. Some of the issues being faced include personhood, abortion, artificial human reproduction (in vitro fertilization, surrogacy, cloning), stem cell research, contraception, genetic manipulation, fertility care, embryo adoption, abnormal pregnancies, the death penalty, pain management, redemptive suffering, end-of-life medical care, euthanasia, assisted suicide, organ donation, and brain death. By the careful integration of faith and reason, SMHS students will learn the true teachings of the Catholic Church in these matters and how they can live out these teachings in order to promote a Culture of Life.

Obviously, certain subjects, by their very nature, lend themselves more towards integration of Culture of Life related topics than others. However, there will be some opportunity to integrate some Culture of Life topics into the non-biological sciences, mathematics, drama, etc.

American Life League’s website at www.all.org offers a wealth of material that teachers have permission to use and copy and it is a good resource for both students and parents to learn more about what it truly means to promote a Culture of Life.

September’s Guest Speaker “Abby Johnson”

On September 7th St. Michael High School was privileged to have Abby Johnson as this month’s guest speaker to talk to our school.

Abby travels sharing her experience and horrors when she used to work for Planned Parenthood as clinic director.

Here is what one student shared from Mrs. Hiney’s Class.

Abby Johnson was a product of conception technician at Planned Parenthood. She had two abortions when she was in her early twenties. She then began to volunteer at Planned Parenthood and eventually was hired there. Abby Johnson’s speech was both heart-warming and informative. She spoke about the gruesome abortions and, I’m sure, most people had never even imagined how horrible abortions actually are.

Her talk was extremely inspiring because it shows that even if you are in deep sin, God can show you the way and forgive you. The way she described how she pieced the babies back together was almost too much to bear. When I was listening to her talk, I was thinking of how the Spartans, thousands of years ago, would kill their babies and how we should know better, but millions of women have abortions.

Sports Update

Our student-athletes have started the year off well. Our girls volleyball team has shown great improvement over last year and has kept its first three varsity games very competitive. Against Foxcroft, the girls won the third match. Against Quantico, they took the third match and almost forced a fifth match but Quantico came from behind to win the fourth match. The girls won their first game of the year against Chelsea Academy, winning the first, third and fourth matches.

Cross-country has also done well as our young team attempts to replace many seniors and injured stars from last season. Swimming

Greetings Warriors:

The winter sports season is fast approaching. This will be our second year in the Delaney Athletic Conference (DAC). Last year our boys' team placed third in the DAC and participated in the Virginia Independent High School State Championship. The Championships were covered by Swimming World and can be viewed at <http://tv.swimmingworldmagazine.com/events/2011-virginia-independent-high-school-state-championships/races/9632>. Swimmers are eligible to swim in the State Championships when they obtain a qualifying time for any of the competitive strokes. This year Championships will be held at the Freedom Center.

I highly encourage any student who is interested in swimming to join our Warrior team. The Warrior swim season begins November 7. (Cross Country participants will begin the next week). It is not necessary to know how to swim competitively. The swimmer must be able to swim 2 lengths of the pool, 50 yards to join the team. The swimmers on our team work hard, have fun, and are dedicated. This year one of our swimmers, John Sampson, has started a Warrior Swim Club. He and several swimmers swim after school. They work on stroke technique, turns, and endurance. John is an example of a dedicated and motivated swimmer; he is working on swimming the 400-meter free style for the competitive season. Drea Rich has diligently joined the swim club with the goals of improving her butterfly and breaststrokes.

Swim Clinic: This year St. Michael's will offer the Second Annual Swim Clinic held on **Oct 17- Oct 28** High School (Varsity) times 2:45-3:45, (Junior Varsity) 6-8th grade 3:45-4:45 pm. The Warrior swim clinic is an excellent opportunity to spend focused quality time on technique, development, and refinement of competitive stroke work. The clinic will run for 5 consecutive days, Monday thru Friday for 2 weeks. The clinic will spend time working on specifics: 1. Individual stroke technique focusing on: 2.

Body Position and Balance, proper streamline, catch, head positioning, etc. for all four competitive strokes
3. Drills, and Skills- Various drills to improve technique and make strokes more efficient.
4. Power and Speed- when to apply effort and at what part of the stroke to ensure effectiveness. The cost for the Clinic is 125.00 for those not enrolled at St. Michael's, and 100.00 for those enrolled at St. Michael's. Discounts are offered for more than one swimmer per family. We will need Stroke and Turn officials, Scoring, timers, and concession volunteers. Gina Clancy has volunteered to be the head official for the home meets; Vicky Sampson has volunteered to organize/manage the team. Thank you to all of our volunteers, past and present.
